# Roger George Hutchings (13<sup>th</sup> april 1951 – 28<sup>th</sup> June 2016)

Once again Gittisham went into mourning when we heard the very sad news that Roger had given up his noble fight against Cancer on the 28<sup>th</sup> of June with wife Angie, daughters Frances and Elizabeth and son-in-law Jurgen at his bedside in the R. D. & E Wonford Hospital. He had had many spells in hospital and had set himself goals to achieve. Roger was such an active person being President of the Rotary Club of Otter Valley for a year and having organised several priority events, and, latterly including a most wonderful evening of entertainment at Ottery St. Mary's Church with the Military Wives choir along with the Exmouth Town Concert Band and the Ottery Silver Band. His President's evening was a great success and he arranged for Pete Goss (Vendee Globe yachtsman and hero) to be the guest speaker for the evening. Both Roger and Angie hosted many formal and informal events for Rotary throughout their year of office (Angie was also President of the Inner Wheel Club of Otter Valley – the ladies side of Rotary. In April, Roger was so pleased to be able to walk his daughter Elizabeth up the aisle to marry Jurgen, their wedding took place in Holland which was a long trip to undertake. Roger was our Churchwarden and very much involved with our guinguennial repairs and the work needed on the gallery he was the current chairman of the Mission Community Team Council. Roger is much missed by all who knew him and we wish Angie, Frances, Elizabeth and Jurgen peace in their grieving and may their many memories always be with them. Roger's funeral was on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> July and he is in the churchyard.

Ronald E.H. Pew,BSc(Eng.) CEng FRAeS Gittisham's oldest resident died after a short illness on the 16<sup>th</sup> July age 101. Ronnie spent his working life in the aerospace industry working at Armstrong Sidley's aero division, Fairy Aviation, Plessey Aircraft division, Rotax and Lucas Aerospace. He was also a consultant with Ampep (Dry Bearings) and initiated the use of ceramics in human joint replacements. Ronnie was a very keen and successful golfer and still played the odd hole at Honiton Golf Club until recently. He joined the Aero Golfing Society at 49 and he played to his age at 74, 86 and 92 and has won several trophies including the Brabazon Trophy. Along with his wife Ann they were great supporters of the local Conservatives and held many functions for them. Ronnie had an interesting collection of clocks and indeed looked after the church clock for a great many years and when he couldn't go up into the tower was always able and willing to give advice. Ronnie's funeral was held at St. Michaels, Gittisham on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> August was very well attended by family, friends, former colleagues and many from his golfing fraternity and villagers, he is also buried in the churchyard.

# PARISH COUNCIL – JUNE-AUGUST REPORT **DCC / EDDC Report**.

Susie Bond said that the residents at Trafalgar Bridge near Weston were appealing the enforcement order. She added that EDDC was exploring potential official sites for travellers. The Heart of the South West devolution bid is continuing, but it is unknown what effect Brexit will have on the process.

#### Crime.

- 1) 10th April dog not under control attacked another dog
- 2) 7th-12th April outbuilding broken into and property stolen
- 3) 3rd June (Vale) common assault; domestic incident between partners.

**Finance.** Members agreed the finances.

## Planning applications.

- a) Meriden House, Nags Head Road, Gittisham Removal of render, repointing of revealed stonework and replacement of asbestos roofing with natural slate
- b) Land at the West End of Devonshire Road, Heathpark Industrial Estate Construction of single storey industrial building (Unit A) for use classes B1, B2 and B8; alterations to car park layout, internal access and omission of Unit E as approved under application 07/3056/FUL.
- c) Curlditch House, Gittisham Internal modifications and demolition of conservatory
- d) Devon Violet Nursery, Honiton Certificate of lawful use of the site as a nursery, inc. erection of polytunnels and storage of agricultural, horticultural and building materials along with ancillary sales to members of the public; erection of office building associated with on-site activities
- e) 40 Cypress Close, Honiton Construction of rear extension Members had no objections to the above.
- f) Combe Higher Barn, Gittisham Provision of venue for weddings, conferences and related activities through conversion of existing barns, demolition of pole barns and their replacement with new timber clad barns and provision of associated car parking, enhanced access and landscaping works Members agreed they were not as a parish council against development or business growth, but raised concerns about locating this application within the AONB, and the size of the development in connection with the existing buildings. The potential impact on the local tenant is also of concern.

#### Car parking at The Pig.

Staff from the hotel and Combe Estate, along with members of the public, discussed the overflow staff car park near Talbots. Tom Ross from The Pig asked that they be given time to settle in. At the August meeting Susie Bond said the hotel has 28 days to submit an application for change of use, new access and the bridge.

### Limited residential development in Gittisham village.

David Valentine said there had been a high return rate of the housing needs surveys. The results show there is a need within the village for six affordable homes. A meeting with councillors, EDDC and Devon Communities Together is the next step.

#### Play area.

Russell Hayman said £109.05 had been raised from the memories weekend, which would go towards the play area. David Fallows said he had discussed a structure for the wild area with Hamish Hall and Bill Griffiths and, while inexpensive, will require further fundraising.
