CONGRATULATIONS TO CLIFF WENSLEY

My grandfather, Clifford Wensley has just received his Légion d'Honneur medal from the French government for his Service in Normandy in 1944. The honour is awarded in five divisions, the lowest being *Chevalier*(Knight) - roughly equivalent to an MBE, if he lived in France. Cliff served with the 4th Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment in HQ company in Normandy, part of the Wessex Division. The 4th Wilts landed a couple weeks after D-Day and went straight into the battle for Caen, where they suffered heavy losses in the fight for hill 112 - the Wessex Division were opposed by two SS Panzer regiments (equipped with Tiger tanks etc) there. They were then redeployed for the assault on Mount Pinçon, where again there was heavy fighting in mountainous terrain. The 4th Wilts last action in Normandy was to cross the river Seine along with their sister battalion the 5th Wilts in small boats at Vernon, the first allied troops to cross the river, again under enemy fire. The battalion was then able to rest up for a couple weeks at Monet's house, with some lucky ones getting passes to visit newly liberated Paris, before the advance into the low countries. Superfast Broadband in the village.

Gittisham village residents now have access to a village Superfast wireless network, delivering download speeds of around 20Mbps. This compares with our current systems of just 1-Mbps. This means that you can stream movies, music, play games online and work from home. There are 2 packages, starting at £19.99/month. The installation cost will be refunded if you currently have a very low download speed (<2). PARISH COUNCIL - DECEMBER REPORT

Four councillors met for the December meeting. Susie Bond (EDDC), Phil Twiss (DCC) and one member of the public were also present.

DCC / EDDC Report. Phil Twiss said the three new funding initiatives launched in May to replace the old Town & Parish funds are progressing. They are the Doing What Matters Community Grants Fund, Crowdfund Devon and Making the Connection. He circulated the South West Energy & Environment Group annual report, and said that it was a useful forum particularly in respect of the work it does on climate change and getting DCC to a position of zero net carbon much earlier than its previous target date of 2030.

Susie Bond said EDDC's recycling rates continue to rise and are currently at 62 per cent. EDDC is in first place nationally in the league table of councils for keeping non-recyclable waste low.

Crime. 2 x other theft on or near Parsonage Lane in October. Investigation complete and no suspect identified.

Finance. Members agreed the finances.

Planning applications.

a) Combe Garden Centre – variation of conditions 2 (approved plans) and 3 (restriction on sale of goods) of planning permission for garden centre with restaurant/cafe)to facilitate the sale of a wider range of goods within part of the building (retrospective)

Councillors had no objections to a) in principle. However, they expressed disappointment that the application appeared contrary to the original application, and could potentially undermine other retail opportunities elsewhere.

Bench, Gittisham Vale. Phil Twiss clarified the ownership of the land at the end of Old Elm Road. The clerk agreed to write to the appropriate department at EDDC to ask permission for a bench to be installed.

Climate change measures. Members agreed to endorse the Devon Climate Declaration, which sets out an ambition to tackle climate change that covers the whole county, including those people who live, work in and visit Devon, and those businesses which are based or operate here.

Devonshire Road. Members agreed with David Valentine's comments that traffic along Devonshire Road is increasing, as is the possibility for accidents especially where the road narrows. Phil Twiss encouraged the parish council to request double yellow lines as far as the gym through the appropriate channels, and said a parking order restricting cars would take around one year to come into operation.

Play area. Carol Hall said a tree had fallen across the fence in the corner; the clerk agreed to contact Western Power Distribution. She added that a press release had gone out to recognise the National Lottery funding for the play equipment and support from the East Devon AONB Sustainable Development Fund.

Lengthsman. David Valentine said the drain by Clysthayes is still partly blocked, despite remedial work by EDDC earlier in the year, and he agreed to discuss a way forward with Susie Bond.

Casual vacancies, Gittisham Vale. Members heard that Rhiannon King had decided to step down as parish councillor for the Vale, which leaves two vacancies. Any person interested in coming forward or finding out more about becoming a parish councillor should contact clerk@gittisham.eastdevon.gov.uk
