A FOND FAREWELL TO CLIFF

On the 24th of January St. Michael's Gittisham was lovely and full to say goodbye to Cliff Wensley who died age 101 at his home in Gittisham. Cliff was a stalwart of the church having served about 25 years as churchwarden and longer on the PCC he attended church every week until just before Christmas. As mentioned in a previous Gazette Cliff had recently been awarded The Legion d'Honeur Medal for his WWll service during the D Day and Normandy Landings amongst other campaigns. He served in Italy, was a Desert Rat, among the first to cross the River Seine going on up to Germany through France, Belgium and Holland and crossing the Rhine. Cliff's final act of service was assisting in the rehabilitation and dispersement from the Belsen Bergan Concentration Camp. All his medals were mounted and placed on his coffin for the service. Rest in peace Cliff now you are reunited with your Gladys.

This is followed by one of Pierre's signature dishes, beef cooked slowly in cocoa, while vegans and vegetarians can sample a mushroom and salsify ragout. To finish, choose from either a melt in the mouth fondant au chocolat with raspberry coulis or homemade lemon verbena and rosemary ice cream.

PARISH COUNCIL - FEBRUARY REPORT

Six councillors met for the February meeting. PC Linda Ebdon and two members of the public were also present.

DCC / EDDC Report. Phil Twiss said that following DCC cabinet approval, the Park and Change Science Park scheme will be completed by February next year. The £2.2m scheme will provide 300 parking spaces, secure bike lockers, shared hire bikes, shared hire cars and electric charging points. Susie Bond said EDDC is looking ahead at ways of bridging a £2.7m funding gap over the next four years, following cuts in central government funding. The Council has initiated a public consultation exercise called 'Careful Choices', which is available from www.eastdevon.gov.uk/community-engagement/careful-choices.

Crime. 2 crimes, December 2019

- Vehicle crime, Devonshire Road; investigation complete, no suspect identified;
- Public order, Laburnum Close; unable to prosecute suspect.

PC Linda Ebdon explained that in the light of the recent murder in the parish, she wanted to reassure residents that such incidents are rare and people can contact the police at any time if they have concerns by dialling 101 for general enquiries / information and 999 in an emergency.

Finance. Members agreed the finances.

Andy Wilkins said he was pleased to report that the issues he had brought to DCC's Hayne Farm. attention as regards the road layout and signage would be rectified. He added that the replacement temporary safety barrier on Hayne Lane was not fit for purpose, as it keeps falling into the ditch.

Bench, Gittisham Vale. Peter Orchard said a number of residents had been consulted regarding the preferred site for the bench, and it was agreed to install it at the most favoured location. The clerk agreed to ask EDDC if it would be possible to install a permanent path with an all-weather walking surface from the existing footpath at the bottom of Laburnum Close to the bus turning circle at the bottom of Old Elm Road.

Climate change measures. Members agreed they would like to encourage residents to help mitigate the effects of climate change by signing up to a green energy provider. Carol Hall said she would investigate the possibility of double glazing for listed buildings, as this is being used in one property in the village.

Councillors discussed the bids to carry out the village hall redecoration work and decided Village hall. on the preferred contractor. The project will include repairs to internal and external plaster, new large windows at the front, painting internally and externally, roof timber treatment and insulation and repairs to drains and covers at the front. Members thanked Carol Hall for her work in taking this project forward.

Peter Orchard presented the research he had undertaken into upgrading the pétanque court; Play area. members heard that the total cost would be in the region of £2,500. The clerk agreed to investigate with EDDC whether S106 funds can be used to build the pétangue court from scratch.

It was agreed to approach the lengthsman about the problem with water pouring down the road from Catshayes, as well as the level of salt in the bins around the parish.

Next meeting. This will be on 4th March at 7.30pm in the parish room.
