#### PARISH COUNCIL - JANUARY REPORT

Five councillors met for the January meeting. Susie Bond (EDDC), Phil Twiss (DCC) and two members of the public were also present.

#### DCC / EDDC Report.

Phil Twiss said the delay in transfer of care from acute to social care is markedly improved in recent weeks, although far from the finished 'joined up article'. He added that a useful smartphone application called 'NHS Quicker' is available free of charge from the Apple store or Android 'Google Play' store and is a very useful tool in terms of information on care waiting times for the local Minor Injuries Unit, as well as other NHS services. Susie Bond agreed to contact South West Water, after members expressed concern over the potential capacity of the sewage treatment works. This follows an issue in autumn 2017 with fat, which was finding its way into the sewage flow and causing blockages in the centre of the village.

**Finance.** Members agreed the budget for 2018/19 and the parish precept was maintained for a further year at £8,160.

#### Planning applications.

Richard Pratt said the Hamlet Lodge application for an extension to the garage had been approved with conditions.

#### Casual vacancy.

Following presentations from two strong candidates, members agreed to co-opt Carol Hall as parish councillor for Gittisham village.

## Hayne Lane development.

Developer Baker Estates (BE) sent an update on the new development. Work on the first phase has properly begun, although there have been some delays regarding overhead cable diversions and the signing of an agreement with Devon County Council Highways. The culvert works at the entrance are nearly complete and construction of the first house foundations will begin at the end of this month. BE explained the highways work would mean a temporary road closure around Hayne Lane, and the company said it would do all it can to ensure this process is handled sensitively to minimise the impact on people living in the immediate area. In particular a joint meeting is being arranged with BE, DCC Highways and Leonard Bartlett to ensure that the farming and farm shop activities are understood and managed. A diversion will be signed. BE said the response to the latest application for subsequent phases of the development had been positive, and the company has been responding to some comments which it believes should further improve the scheme. This application should be determined by 23 February. BE stressed that this application is fully compliant with the existing S106 agreement with 40 per cent affordable housing.

#### Broadband.

Phil Twiss reported there had been little movement on this due to the Christmas break, but he said he had written to Connecting Devon & Somerset programme managers, asking that Gittisham parish be considered as a priority for use of 'gain share' funding. He said he had also written to Matt Barrow at CDS before Christmas, asking him to look at the previous quote for the cost of bringing fibre to the village from the direction of the Iron Bridge.
