TO VOTE IN OR OUT - THAT IS THE QUESTION BY 2 VILLAGERS

Why I shall vote REMAIN. First of all, this is the most important vote that I shall ever make. If we decide to LEAVE, then that will be an irreversible decision and the future for Britain,its place in the World and its economy will be irrevocably changed. ...Ah, I hear you say, we will control our borders.....Well, that depends on whether we want to continue to trade with the EU. When the Swiss voted to remain outside the EU, it took ten years to establish full trade agreements – including fully open borders. Now they have voted to restrict immigration, but they will lose their trade agreements unless they keep the borders open. If we don't want to trade with the EU, what impact will that have on, for example, Honda's factory in Swindon (built here for easy access to the large EU market), London's financial sector, etc? The knock-on effect in jobs and lost taxes could be horrendous. Also what will our borders with the South. (And what about Gibraltar?) Well, what about sovereignty? Parliament is still sovereign (it can vote to leave the EU), but the practicalities of sovereignty are compromised by the existence of multi-national corporations. Many of our major assets are owned by foreign companies, over which we have little control. Can a smaller Britain successfully negotiate with Amazon, Apple, Google, News International, etc?

The EU has or is negotiating free-trade deals with America, China and India, from which a post-Brexit Britain would be excluded. The EU has 53 such deals. Britain would have to try to replicate them, a huge challenge given its lack of trade negotiators and the length of time even simple trade talks take. There are many other arguments, but I know what I feel. We need all the friends we can find in these troubled times. There are threats that transcend our borders eg climate change. We need to keep the friends we've got, not push them away. Being in the EU provides massive opportunities for business, research and development, culture, travel and work for those who feel adventurous. Our science, our cultural environment and our Health Service have benefitted enormously from EU membership. Let's look outwards not inwards. So I shall vote REMAIN and remain proud to be English, British and European.

On the 23rd of June we all face a decision on whether we LEAVE the EU or stay in. We all have our own opinions and there have already been some heated arguments, not only nationally but locally and amongst friends. I, and I stress this is my personal view, would like to see the UK leave the European Union as I believe we can do better by standing on our own two feet and making Britain 'Great' again. We pay the EU system £13bn per annum and yes I know we get £4.5bn back in spending and support, so that leaves a large deficit of £8.5bn. I am sure as an independent UK we could carry on supporting areas that currently get support from the EU with this money and help business and industry to be ever more competitive in the trading world. 50% of our exports go to the EU, that is not going to suddenly stop overnight, nor is the importation of EU goods to the UK. Yes there will be much work for government to do, for once, and it may take a while but to be free from many of the restrictive regulations that stifle manufacturing and most businesses will be a blessing.

We can control our borders again, making them safe and have a fair system of entry into the UK taking those that we need to help us build our Greater Britain. That is not being racist or inhumane, it is being sensible, it prevents all those that believe our streets are paved with gold and everything is free, from entering our country. Shocked and you don't think there are people like this, there are many countries that believe this. If you are of benefit to us then please come in

Do you believe in democracy? Our United Kingdom was built on democratic values with a few internal wars and disagreement along the way. We have a system where we vote for our governments and the local bodies that look after our counties and Parishes and when we think they are doing a bad job we vote them out. The European Union is headed by 5 Presidents or is that 7 or 8? No one seems to know let alone know who they are, what they do and who put them in this great position of power in the first place. The EU has digressed from a free trade agreement into an un-bureaucratic monolithic state and although we may vote in or out, ultimately it will take an Act of Parliament to decide if we leave or not which will mean that our elected Members of Parliament will have the final say. Why are we bothering?
