GITTISHAM COMMUNITY LAND TRUST UPDATE DAVID VALENTINE

I have commented in the past of the need to engage with the local community at various key stages in matters to do with the GCLT. The project to provide a small affordable housing scheme must be seen to be community led and the forthcoming Open Public Meeting to be held on Thursday 16th May at 7.00pm in the Village Hall will focus on the background to the GCLT Board's recommendation having identified a preferred site.

This meeting is a key milestone in the overall timetable and the endorsement of the preferred site by the community will provide the platform to appoint solicitors, a Housing Association partner and consultants to undertake site surveys and to prepare briefing documentation prior to the appointment of architects. We are currently preparing a grant application to cover some of the initial costs and further grant applications will be made to cover consultant costs etc.

This is another opportunity for the community to show it's support for the work of the GCLT Board and it's adviser's and we look forward to discussing the preferred site with you during this important meeting.

PARISH COUNCIL - MAY REPORT

Five councillors met for the May meeting. Phil Twiss (DCC), and one member of the public were also present. Russell Hayman was elected Chair and Carol Hall Vice Chair.

Phil Twiss said the Care Quality Commission (CQC) had carried out a routine DCC / EDDC Report. announced inspection at the RD&E in January and February this year. The hospital has retained an overall rating of 'Good' in the CQC's report. He added that as the DCC appointed RD&E Governor, he considered this a fantastic achievement, which reflects well on the quality of the services provided to people and communities in East Devon. The report also rated the Minor Injuries Unit in Honiton as 'good'. Phil Twiss said the Director of Public Health's annual report had been published, and it focuses on the theme of mental health. The report suggests there should be wider recognition of, and action to address, the inequality that exists for people with serious mental health issues in terms of physical health, employment and housing.

Regarding beavers, Phil Twiss reported that the trial on the River Otter, led by the Devon Wildlife Trust, is now in its fifth and final year. The beavers are currently thriving, with this winter's survey having identified activity hotspots throughout the river, with at least 7 or 8 family groups present. He said that preparations are now well advanced for providing the required information to the Government, so a decision can be reached on whether the beavers will be allowed to remain on the river.

In her absence, Susie Bond sent a message to say that following the election on 2 May, there has been an immense change in the make-up of the new district council with the Independents now the largest group with 31 seats.

Finance. Members approved the annual accounts and governance statement for 2018/19 and noted the finances this month.

Councillor vacancies. The clerk said that two vacancies for parish councillors representing the Vale remain. Applications are particularly welcome from people living in the Vale or the new Hayne Lane development. Councillors noted the annual safety inspection report, and agreed to replace the rotting Plav area. benches. Carol Hall said the East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty partnership had awarded the parish council £250 to fund the cost of enhancing the wild play area. She said she would source bird, bug and bee houses. Maggie Walker said she would ask the lengthsman to review how the small gate closes.

Off-road vehicles. Some residents have raised concerns about the large number of off-road vehicles using bridleways in the parish. Part of the bridleway near Summer Lane is severely worn and one part in particular now has a very deep drop and only a very narrow and unstable path for a horse or walkers to use. Susie Bond understands that if the issue is on private land, the landowner should get in touch with the police. It was agreed to contact Combe Estate to seek their agreement to put up some posters prohibiting illegal use of bridleways. The clerk said she would ask the police for advice on how to address the issue.

We still have some calves and dry cows at Hayne so still running the roads a bit but the aim is to get them moved in the next few weeks. I expect the new residents at Hayne farm developments will be glad to not hear the calves blaring! Most of the maize is planted and the first cut silage is in the pit and sheeted down with minutes to spare before the rain! Pleased with the quality on the day but the analysis will interpret this at a later date.
