Frederick Charles Blackmore MBE

10th July 19 1923 - 18th October 2017

Fred moved to Gittisham with his parents when he was four years old. His Father was the chauffeur cum gardener for the Vicar and Fred's family lived in The Rectory Cottage. Fred and his brothers attended the Village School at Gittisham before moving on to Senior School in Honiton. Fred had many tales of his escapades at school. On one occasion Fred and his brother Wilf went to shoot pigeons with young visitors from the Rectory and they cooked the pigeons in clay in the hot embers of a fire they built. He clearly recalled planting snowdrops on the banks of the cottage with his Father and they still flourish there today.

As a boy, Fred always attended church sitting with other children at the front where the vicar could keep an eye on them from the pulpit! He sang with other children in a choir and went to Combe House to sing carols for the 'Squire and his Lady'. After leaving school at the age of fourteen, Fred became an apprenticed Barber in Honiton. After a stint in ice cream and then working for the Co-Op, he volunteered to join the RAF. While waiting to be called forward he went to work as an apprenticed Baker which he enjoyed. In later life bread making was always his speciality. In 1942, Fred joined the RAF and, after a number of training courses, he became a flight engineer. He joined No 578 Squadron based in Yorkshire. During his time there he carried out 36 operations against targets in Germany and occupied territories. Fred's time in the Royal Air Force influenced him for the rest of his life and he remained a stalwart member of the local Royal Air Force Association, the Air Crew Association and also his beloved 578 Squadron Association. His experiences remained a dominant part in his life memories. After demobilisation Fred worked in a number of Bakeries before obtaining a job with the Home Office Stores Department where he remained for the rest of his working life. In 1981 he was awarded the MBE for his services to the Home Office.

In 1950, in the Parish Church, Fred married his first wife, Betty, an old school friend from Gittisham. As a Civil Servant Fred ultimately moved to several other depots around the country. Fred and Betty did not have any children of their own, but he was always a family man so it was a natural progression for him to take over the role of surrogate Father and Grand Father to Nigel and his family when Fred's brother died. That bond became an important part of his life and he will be missed by Nigel and his family. Sadly, Betty died in 1984.

All his life Fred was a sport enthusiast and played Football, was a Cricket Umpire a keen golfer and became President of Feniton Bowling Club. In more recent times he was an avid watcher of sport on his TV.

Fred married Pam, a near neighbour, in 1986 and together both Pam and Fred became ardent supporters of St Michael's Parish Church and were committed in raising funds for the Bells and also for providing other furbishments, several of the tapestry hangings and kneelers were sewn by Fred. The sum of £14,000 was raised to provide two new bells and to bring the old bells up to standard. He also, along with Col. Starr started the 200 Club which is still in operation and now run by Carol McCann. Fred continued his support for St Michael's after Pam died showing kindness and concern for all he knew.

A Service of Thanksgiving, conducted by the Reverend Prebendary Sue Roberts was held in St Michael's on 3rd November and the ashes were interred in the Church Cemetery afterwards. Fred will be greatly missed by all whose life he touched.

Press Release - Annual awards are a chance to nominate Devon's recycling heroes

Devon residents and communities are being called on to nominate their unsung recycling heroes, whose efforts have helped the county remain one of the greenest in the UK.

The Fifth Recycle Devon Thank You Awards will be held on 16 March. Nominations for the eight categories, including those for schools, businesses, and community groups, can be submitted on the Recycle Devon website from 1 November 2017 to 1 December 2017. The Thank You Awards are organised by the Recycle Devon team, and were first launched to recognise those people who do that bit extra to help ensure Devon remains clean and green.

At last count 55.7 per cent of the total rubbish collected or taken to recycling centres in Devon that could otherwise have been disposed of, was recycled. There will be a public vote after shortlisting to nominate 'Your Overall Recycling Hero', which will be featured on the Recycle Devon Website. There will be prizes and recognition for all shortlisted nominees.

The end of an era! Yesterday was our last milk collection with the tanker collecting our final 800 litres of milk. The last 45 cows have been dried off and will be fattened for a month before going for meat. It has been so strange going from milking nearly 500 cows and sending 12,000 litres a day, down to that. It's not quite over yet though, as we've had 12 new heifers calve in the last couple of weeks; these we have to keep milking until they go to market on the 21st Nov, but the milk will just go to the calves. It takes longer to start the parlour up and wash it through after than it does to actually milk them.

So now the big clean up must begin. It's bad enough trying to move house and realising how much 'stuff' I have to get rid of, but then you look in all the sheds around the farm...stuff, stuff and more stuff! I'm not really sure where to begin, and we really need to get rid of things rather than just continuously move them from one place to another. The farm sale is booked for Sat 17th March 2018, so we need to have everything sorted before then. It really doesn't seem very far away now, in fact I can feel tears coming to my eyes as I write this. It's all very strange having been here since I was 7 years old, and now having my children here as well. Next year really will be a year of change.

On a more positive note, many thanks to everyone that came along to our coffee mornings, and for the wonderful cakes, we received. Donations of just over £240, which we topped up, and banked a nice round figure of £250 for Macmillan Cancer Care. I do hope you might hear news from the calf rearing unit in Fenny Bridges in time to come, but that depends on Mum!
