PARISH COUNCIL - NOVEMBER REPORT

Five councillors met for the November meeting. Four members of the public were also present.

DCC / EDDC Report. In his report, Phil Twiss explained that a public consultation is due to run until 10th December, ahead of undertaking a fresh procurement to find contractors to provide superfast broadband for those areas of Devon and Somerset without access to it.

He said that having had some time to read through the supporting documents, it appears that yet again Gittisham is being overlooked as a result of companies submitting their proposals during the Open Market Review, who are not prepared to cover the area. He said therefore that Voneus was the only viable option at present for village residents. David Valentine said it was important to ask Phil Twiss to pursue the case for a full fibre connection in the future, rather than just wifi. Susie Bond said EDDC is carrying out a review of its car park charges, which have remained the same since 2010. A report to Cabinet recommending EDDC goes out to public consultation with a proposal to increase charges by 20% (from £1/hour to £1.20/hour) in its most popular car parks has resulted in the decision being called in and the entire car parking strategy now being reviewed.

Finance. Members agreed the finances.

Casual vacancy, Gittisham Vale. Members heard that Andy Wilkins had decided to step down as parish councillor for the Vale. Any person interested in coming forward or finding out more about becoming a parish councillor should contact clerk@gittisham.eastdevon.gov.uk

Lengthsman. David Valentine said that leaf fall would start to clog up drains etc, so members agreed to keep an eye on anything that would require the lengthsman's intervention.

Play area. Members heard that there are now permanent 'no entry' signs and a padlock on the entrance to the upper part of the play area, to deter users from entering and exiting directly onto the road. Carol Hall reported that a site visit had taken place to consider the various options for reducing the visual impact of the slide / tower. It was agreed to plant a cherry tree and install some instant hedging close to the equipment. The tree is expected to grow to between three and four metres. A proposal to paint the flags green was accepted, with a review of measures taken to be carried out in six months' time.

Park bench. Members heard that once ownership of the land at the bottom of Old Elm Road is clarified, a bench will be requested.

Energy use. The clerk said Devon Communities Together was offering to hold a public event to advise residents on the best energy-saving measures and how to heat your home effectively. She agreed to get in touch to express an interest in a visit.

Noticeboard. The clerk said she had asked an Axminster-based company to quote for a parish council noticeboard for the Hayne Farm site.

Next meeting. This will be on 4th December in the parish room.
